

## Hunt Chapter 17 Panel Topics

Panel 1: Introduction and The Atlantic System and the World Economy (pp. 519 - 529)

Panel 2: New Social and Cultural Patterns (pp. 529 - 536)

Panel 3: Consolidation of the European State System (pp.536 - 545)

Panel 4: Lady Montagu, Birth of the Enlightenment, and Conclusion (pp. 545 - 550)

To prepare for historical panels, all students (except those presenting the panel) must have the Historical Panels worksheet completed BEFORE the panel presents.

Each panel is comprised of 5 students.

The first panelist to present is the **Quiz Master**. This panelist's task is to prepare quiz questions about the section. Students earn points for responding to question and adding additional information to the discussion. The Quiz Master will begin the presentation.

Following the Quiz Master, the **Word Wizard** will present (The Word Wizard should put words on board as Quiz Master is presenting). The Word Wizard choose the three to five most important terms to define, use in a sentence, synonym with examples, and antonym with example when appropriate.

**The Relationship Expert** looks for cause and effect. This expert will present and discuss three cause-and-effect relationships.

**The Image Master** creates a PowerPoint presentation to pull it all together. Slides must show one cause and effect, at least one cause and effect relationship (this may or may not be one discussed by the Relationship Expert, at least three key terms, the beliefs and goals of at least one major historical figure.

Finally, the **Summarizer** ties it all up. Using key words as magnets, this expert summarizes key points.
