

The French Revolution and Napoleon

Hunt Chapters 20, and 21 (sections 1, 2 &3), Palmer Chapters 9 and 10
83 points possible

Outline sections of Hunt Chapter 20 that do not relate directly to the French Revolution (Protesters in the Low Countries and Poland, European Reactions to the French Revolution, Poland Extinguished and Revolution in the Colonies. (15 points)

Read *Consequences of the French Revolution* and respond to the questions on page 776. (10 points)

Read *Napoleon: For and Against* and respond to the questions on page 797. Be sure to explain your reasons for 1 & 2. (8 points)

French Revolution Account

(50 points)

You will produce a creative (yet historically accurate) account of the French Revolution. The format you choose is up to you. It may be in the form of a journal, storybook, letters, newspaper clippings, scrapbook, comic strip, video script, multimedia such as powerpoint or flash or any other style or media you choose. Be creative. Incorporate images **with captions** whenever possible. All projects must be printed and turned in.

You will use all terms from the required word bank, and at least 5 terms from the supplementary word bank. Each term must be used in such a way that it is clear that you understand the meaning and importance of the term. Terms **MUST BE BOLD** or **HIGHLIGHTED** and **BE NUMBERED CONSECUTIVELY** (not in the order appearing in the word bank).
